HOTARC operates Field Day as W5ZDN—a "2A Club" station. "2A" means two HF transmitters using generated power. In addition, we are allowed a UHF/VHF station

and a GOTA Station. GOTA stands for "Get On The Air," an opportunity for unlicensed individuals and hams who don't or can't operate HF bands to get on HF!

HOTARC's recently renovated trailer will house our

first station, set up for SSB Phone (voice). Using the HF beam antenna, this is a great station from which to make contacts to the continental United States. Come check out our updated trailer when you visit our site!

HOTARC's second station will be mostly operating CW (Morse code) again this year. During the day, John Curry K5IMC is our primary operator at the CW station, but overnight it is available for other operators and other modes. Are you inclined to operate after sunset? Come out and use our excellent CW station setup!



Based on a survey of members, we'll provide grilled Hot Dogs and Hamburgers for dinner, along with trimmings and sides, and maybe even some dessert. Hurricane Watch Net (HWN)

Hurricane season begins on 1 June and ends on 30 November. It is during this time that the Hurricane Watch Net (HWN), the primary wide-area amateur radio hurricane response and information



source, is activated. The HWN serves as eyes and ears for the National Weather Service, and relays official weather bulletins to those monitoring the Net in affected areas. The Net also serves as a back-up communication link between NWS forecast centers, EOCs, and other disaster relief efforts. Just as our local Bakers Dozen Weather Net provides real time confirmation of central Texas severe weather to the NWS, the HWN does the same over the wide area affected by hurricane activity.

The HWN is activated for all hurricanes that are a threat to land in the Atlantic and Eastern Pacific. This HF Net will normally activate when a hurricane is moving towards land at a range of 300 miles. The National Hurricane Center may occasionally request activation for a tropical storm, sometimes even a storm that is over 300 miles from land.

Once activated, the HF HWN has the following primary functions:

- 1. **Disseminate hurricane advisory information** to marine interests, Caribbean island nations, emergency operations centers, and other interests in the Atlantic and Eastern Pacific.
- 2. **Obtain weather information** from reporting stations and observers who are not part of the routine network for the National Weather Service.
- 3. **Function as a backup wide-area communication** link for the National Hurricane Center, emergency operations centers, the National Weather Service, and other vital interests involved in the protection of life and property before, during, and after hurricane events.
- 4. **Relay initial damage assessments** to the National Hurricane Center.

The HWN and the operation of W4EHW at the National Hurricane Center in Miami are staffed entirely by volunteers. Net operations are usually conducted on 14.325 MHz, although when band conditions warrant the Net moves to 3.950 MHz.
