

Bearathon After Action

All in, we had 4 operators in action, NA5X was net control with access to the McLane Stadium EOC, KA5DAH and KE5UBO were on course, and KI5PCQ was the Race Director's shadow on site. Present in the EOC were members of Baylor DPS, McLennan County Sheriffs Dept, BSW Southwest Sports Medicine, and AMR EMT.

All in all there were 1,223 finishers, and the first place male completed in 1hr 11 mins and the first place female completed in 1hr 24 minutes.

We had we had 1 runner collapse at finish line, she was revived on scene, and transported to Hospital for treatment. I was informed around 1230 that the runner was stable and doing well. We had 1 Runner transported FROM the course to McLane Stadium via EMS, we had 1 runner transported from course via Chase Car (No injuries) to McLane Stadium, and we had one walk up injury to the EMS tent.

We had several people throw up at the finish line.

All in all given how few operators we had, HOTARC showed up and showed out on this event and Tanner indicated he was DEEPLY pleased with how efficient we were at relaying communication and getting ambulances to the right locations. So kudos to Mike as he was the big guy in the sky relaying information.

Bearathon utilized Zello VoIP PTT App to eliminate the costly radios and it seemed to do rather well though they still had issues in the park, so I don't see us being replaced by cellular any time soon.
